

SCHOOL-COMMUNITY RELATIONS GOALS

Good school-community relationships require cooperative development and maintenance of efficient two- way channels of communication between the school and the community.

Some of the major goals of the district in communicating with the public are to:

- 1) inform the public about the work of the schools;
- 2) improve the partnership of parents and teachers in meeting the education needs of children;
- 3) develop awareness of the importance of education in a democracy;
- 4) integrate the home, school and community in improving educational opportunities for all children;
- 5) clarify the aims, objectives and work of the school;
- 6) make school facilities and personnel available for community use, within limits set by the Board;
- 7) make use of community resources in carrying out the educational program.

The Board believes that the quality of a school program is related to public understanding of what schools are attempting to do.
