School Environment

Since 1968, the U.S. Department of Education (ED) has conducted the Civil Rights Data Collection (CRDC) to collect data on key education and civil rights issues in our nation's public schools. The CRDC is a federally-mandated survey that collects data on factors that impact education equity and opportunities for students and is administered by ED Office for Civil Rights (OCR) as part of its strategy for monitoring and enforcing civil rights statutes. The CRDC collects a variety of information, including student enrollment and educational programs and services data that are disaggregated by race/ethnicity, sex, English learner, and disability. Every public LEA in the 50 states, Washington, D.C., and Puerto Rico is required to complete the CRDC survey.


The most current OCR data is for the 2020-2021 school year. In late 2023, OCR launched a redesigned CRDC web site (civilrightsdata.ed.gov) that includes an archival tool with access to historical civil rights data from 1968 to 1998. Helpful hint regarding the new site: The new website is not limited to what's immediately visible on your screen – scroll down, click on the various buttons and navigation links, explore! The following instructions are intended to help you better locate Uinta 4 data on the Federal OCR website.

1. In the search box at the top right of the window, type the word "Uinta" (not case-sensitive). On mobile devices or tablets, access the search box by clicking on the hamburger icon (3 stacked lines):





- Select "Uinta County School District #4, Mountain View, WY" (highlighted in the list of districts as shown above).
- 3. Notice "Quick Stats" at the bottom of the window, which is prompting you to <u>scroll down</u> to view data for the entire district:



You'll find the individual schools listed at the very end of that section; however, clicking the "Find Schools Nearby" button jumps past the district data directly to the schools listing:



Click anywhere in the school's row to be taken to the individual school's data.





4. Notice "Quick Stats" again at the bottom of the window, which is prompting you to <u>scroll down</u> to view data for the school you've chosen.

5. The data defaults to the 2021-21 report; however, you can view the data from previous data collections by clicking on the tiny arrow to the right of the words "Collection Year: 2020-21" and making a selection from the drop-down list as shown below:








School Admission of Non-Resident Students

Wyoming state law requires any child who is a resident of this state "and whose seventh birthday falls on or before August 1, or September 15 if the child started kindergarten pursuant to an approved request... of any year and who has not yet attained his sixteenth birthday or completed the tenth grade" to attend school - whether it be public, private, parochial and church or religious school, a home-based educational program.



Uinta 4 enrolls many students who reside in a neighboring school district (Uinta 1, Uinta 6, even Sweetwater 2).

Parents residing in Uinta County should verify their district of residence with the Uinta County Assessor's Office, which can be found online at the following website: https://uintacounty.com/18/County-Assessor

Go to the Uinta County Assessor's **Map Server** feature. Once you've accessed the map server, click "on" the box for School Districts under Administrative Layers to make the school district boundaries visible.

The Uinta 4 Board of Trustees has the sole discretion to admit or not admit pupils resident in other districts to this school district for any reason deemed appropriate by the Board of Trustees except in the case of a student requesting admission from a district that does not maintain a high school wherein that district has agreed to pay tuition in addition to transportation or maintenance for the child to attend school in this district.
